Applying to Annunciation Catholic School

Annunciation Catholic School is currently accepting applications for grades PS3-8 for the 2021 - 2022 school year. For more information or to schedule a school visit, contact the school office at 252-447-3137.

Entrance Age: Children entering Preschool must be 3 years old on or before August 31 to be considered for admission in the current academic year. Children entering Prekindergarten must be 4 years old on or before August 31 to be considered for admission in the current academic year. Children entering Kindergarten are to be 5 years old on or before August 31 for enrollment in the current academic year.

Application: Complete the application form, answering all application items in detail and return to the school office with a \$50.00 per child non-refundable application fee. Applications submitted without required copies will be considered incomplete and will be held until application is complete.

Acceptance of Admission: A student's admission is conditional upon the satisfactory completion of the year in progress. Admission is based on the match of the student's needs, abilities, and achievement to the programs offered by the Annunciation Catholic School. Criteria used to determine this match are transcripts, an interview (when possible) and other application and registration information.

Notification of Admission: Based upon satisfactory completion of the application process, review of a student's application and strength of credentials, and space availability, a student will be extended an offer of admission with a letter of acceptance, tuition agreement, and registration packet.

Tuition: All fees are included in the total cost of tuition, with the exception of the initial application fee of \$50 for all grades. All students in grades must pay a \$150 book/supply fee.

- The actual cost to educate your child is \$7,200 per year. We asked that each family pay \$5,300 for the 2020-2021 school year as this is what it cost to pay our teachers' salaries. Tuition rates for the 2021-2022 school year will be announced in April 2021.
- To make up the difference, we ask that you volunteer your time, talent and treasure. All is needed and welcome.
- We turn no one away that has the desire to get the quality education that ACS has to offer. That is why we offer indexed tuition to meet the needs of every family. You need to go to www.factstuitionaid.com and fill out the application. The acceptance committee bases aid on your family's need. This is strictly confidential and should not be discussed with anyone other than Father Upah, Mrs. Benedict, Mrs. Ortiz or Mrs. Bragg. To do so could nullify any and all agreements. 2021-2022 Uniform Requirements

Girls Summer Uniform PK – 5

Navy shorts, skirt, or skort with white logo polo shirt
Mass Attire: Plaid Jumper with Long or Short Sleeved Peter Pan Collar Blouse (White)

Girls Winter Uniform PK – 5

Navy trousers, skirt, or skort with white logo polo shirt
Navy blue logo sweatshirt or sweater
Mass Attire: Plaid Jumper with Long or Short Sleeved Peter Pan Collar Blouse (White)

Girls Summer Uniform 6-8

Plaid skirt or navy shorts with white or navy blue logo polo shirt
Mass Attire: Plaid skirt with white logo oxford and optional tie

Girls Winter Uniform 6-8

Plaid skirt or navy trousers with white or navy blue logo polo shirt
Navy blue logo sweatshirt or sweater OR Saints Hoodie
Mass Attire: Plaid skirt with white logo oxford and optional tie

PE Uniforms PK – 8

Solid navy PE Shorts and gray logo t-shirt. Navy sweatpants should be worn during winter uniform.

Belts

Black, brown or blue belts should be worn with navy shorts and trousers (boys and girls grades 1-8)

Shoes

Mass attire: brown, black, or navy leather dress shoes (Sperry shoes of solid color are acceptable)
On days when students do not have *Mass*: Any color athletic shoe is permitted.

Socks and Tights

Solid white, navy or black socks will be worn with the uniform. Socks must cover ankles. Girls may wear navy or white tights with skirts, skorts, and jumpers.

Schedule

Students will wear summer uniforms during the first and fourth nine weeks. Students will wear winter uniforms during the second and third nine weeks. Students will wear dress uniforms on *Mass* days and on other days as specified by the administration

Uniforms are available at our “Angels and Saints” Uniform Shop, in the Parish Office Building (Re/Max). Please call our office for hours. Uniforms may be purchased from any school uniform provider. The Purpose of the Uniform

Uniforms in a Catholic school are a sign of inclusion that help promote a sense of belonging. The proper uniform should be looked upon as instructional. Looking clean and well-groomed shares a lot about our students’ attitudes towards themselves and others. Through the uniform policy, we teach our students about appropriate attire for academics, athletics, and more formal dress occasions.

ADDITIONAL UNIFORM GUIDELINES

1. Only middle school students (Grades 6-8) may wear athletic or ACS logo hoodie sweatshirts.
2. Only official school logo uniforms may be worn in the classroom or in church.
3. Make-up may not be worn or brought to school.
4. French nails, nail tips or color polish may not be worn.
5. Only one chain necklace may be worn with a religious medal or cross in which the medal or cross is 1" or less.
6. No rings, wrist or ankle bracelets may be worn. The only exception is that students may wear no more than one bracelet supporting a Non-Profit or charitable organization or cause, i.e. LiveStrong. No silly band or any other bracelet of that type is allowed.
7. Girls may wear only one pair of stud earrings, with one earring in each ear. Dangling earrings and/or hoops may not be worn due to safety reasons.
8. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings.
9. Shirts are to be tucked in at all times.
10. Girls and boys are to wear belts with pants and shorts with belt loops (Grades K-8). Belt loops MAY NOT be cut off of trousers or shorts.
11. Boys' hair must be worn no longer than collar length. Fad haircuts are not permitted. Fad haircuts include spiked hair, initials cut into the hair or mohawks. No dyed hair is permitted.
12. Skirts, shorts, skorts (preK – 5th grade) and jumpers must be no shorter than two inches above the kneecap.
13. Cologne and perfume are not permitted.
14. Only logo ACS outerwear may be worn in the classroom.
15. Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts may wear their uniforms on meeting days.
16. Hats may not be worn inside the building, except on special days.
17. Scrunchies, hair clips, rubber bands, etc. must be in the hair, not worn on wrists.
18. Students must wear white or navy blue knee socks or crew socks. Ankles must be covered. White or blue tights are allowed with winter uniform.
19. No cargo or painter-style pants may be worn with uniform. Trousers and shorts must be plain navy blue.

To show school spirit and to sometimes just have some fun, theme days are held. Announcements will be made when these times occur.

ENFORCEMENT OF UNIFORM

Students not in proper uniform (i.e. PE uniform vs. regular uniform) will be given uniform slip which must be signed by parent. 5 uniform slips equal a demerit.

OUT-OF-UNIFORM GUIDELINES

Appropriate dress is required.

- Shorts/skirts must be no shorter than 2 inches above the knee
- Dressy jeans (blue jeans may not have any raggedy ends, holes, or lose strands and no skinny jeans)
- No jogging suits
- No clothing that is tight – no tights or leggings as pants
- No sandals or flip flops
- Tank tops
- T-shirts with inappropriate writing, wording, pictures, or logos
- No unauthorized jewelry, makeup, or nail polish

Good Rule of Thumb: If you have to ask, the answer is probably no. If you think you shouldn't wear it, you shouldn't.
